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### **Covid-19 Arrival**

Upon arrival complete the Covid-19 intake form on your patient portal. To access the patient portal, go to:

If you have not created your account on the patient portal call or email our office to have the link sent.

### **Questions to ask yourself before coming into the office:**

- Have you experienced any of these Covid symptoms (Fever or chills; cough; shortness of breath or difficulty breathing; fatigue; muscle or body aches; headache; new loss of taste or smell; sore throat; congestion or runny nose; diarrhea; nausea; and vomiting) during the last 48 hours?
- Have you traveled outside of the United States in the past 14 days?
- Have you been in close physical contact (6 feet or closer for a total of 15 minutes) with anyone known to have COVID-19 or COVID-19 symptoms within the past 14 days?
- Are you awaiting the results of a COVID-19 test (other than a routine test required by an employer or healthcare provider)?
- Have you tested positive for COVID-19 within the past 21 days?

### **Acknowledgement of COVID-19 Risk**

The COVID-19 virus is highly contagious and has a long incubation period. You or your healthcare providers may have the virus, not show symptoms and yet still be highly contagious. COVID-19 can result in life-threatening respiratory disease in some patients. You may be exposed to COVID-19 at any time or in any place. Due to the frequency and timing of visits by other dental patients, the characteristics of the virus, and the characteristics of dental procedures, there is an elevated risk of you contracting the virus simply by being in a dental office.

Dental procedures can create fine water spray or "aerosols" which may remain in the air for several minutes to hours. These aerosols may contain the COVID-19 virus and may create a risk of COVID-19 exposure. You cannot wear a protective mask over your mouth to reduce exposure during treatment as your healthcare providers need access to your mouth to render care.

To provide a safe environment for our patients and staff, this office follows the applicable state and federal regulations and protocols for infection control, universal personal protection, and disinfection. However, due to the nature of the procedures we provide, it is not possible to maintain social distancing between patients, doctors, and staff at all times.
